About the Performer

Mark Willey is Director of Music and Organist here at the Spencerville Seventh-day Adventist Church where he coordinates the Evensong Concert Series, accompanies the sanctuary choir and is responsible for the music presented in the worship services. He holds degrees in organ performance from the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore and the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. In addition to his work as a performing musician, he is an accomplished recording engineer and producer, climber, cyclist and competitive triathlete. Upcoming Concerts

Tomorrow, November 4, 5:30 p.m.

The newly married Joy Leilani Garbutt and Mark Willey, are hosting a concert tomorrow in celebration of their wedding. The concert will feature three great performers, cellist Amit Peled, pianist Michael Sheppard and organist Erik Wm. Suter playing works by Bach, Haydn, Brahms, Tournemire and Langlais. November 17, 4 p.m.

Organist Devon Howard and mezzo-soprano Karla Rivera Bucklew will present a program of compositions and improvisations based on familiar hymn tunes. Karla is an accomplished singer with degree in vocal performance from Washington Adventist University (B.M.) and the University of Maryland (M.M.). She has performed around the globe in oratorio, solo and operatic roles. Devon recently completed his Doctor of Music Arts degree at Arizona State University as a student of Kimberly Marshall. He is a Fullbright Scholar with a particular interest in improvisation.
